




## **EDUCATION**, OUR KEY COMMITMENT

The International Association of Educating Cities (IAEC) is a non-profit organisation formed by local governments around the world who are committed to education as a tool for social transformation that fosters the exchange of ideas, reflections and best practices among its members.

The **Charter of Educating Cities**, made up of a preamble and twenty principles, is our roadmap to build friendly, accessible, dynamic, sustainable, healthy, inclusive, participatory, fair, and creative cities committed to lifelong education.



### EDUCATION IN THE CITY, A SHARED COMMITMENT

**Education in the Educating City is a tool for social transformation.** We're talking about lifelong education that spans the many spheres of civic life.

In turn, education is the cornerstone of the **city project.** It's a political commitment that seeks to raise awareness about the fact that, whether intentionally or unintentionally, local policies and municipal actions convey knowledge, values and attitudes.

The Educating City also involves **shared governance**, which is based on mainstreaming actions between municipal areas and on fostering dialogue and collaboration between the municipal government and civil society, with the aim of mobilising and connecting the maximum possible number of educational agents that have an impact on the territory.

#### OUR DOORS ARE OPEN

Any local government that wishes to commit to the principles of the Charter of Educating Cities can become an active member of the Association, regardless of their administrative powers in education.

#### Some reasons to become a member

- **Learn, debate and exchange** knowledge and experiences with other cities.
- **Improve municipal management** in favour of a greater mainstreaming of actions and networking with civil society.
- Carry out joint projects.
- **Promote and publicise** municipal policies and initiatives on an international level.
- Join forces to tackle new global challenges.

#### How to proceed

To sign up to the IAEC, the request must be approved by the municipal decision-making body of elected politicians

(municipal council or others). Final ratification of the request corresponds to the General Assembly.

Members undertake to maintain the IAEC by means of annual membership fee (stipulated according to the number of inhabitants and the Gross National Product per capita — Atlas method).
