Therefore, education in values, which was the motto of this year's Award, is particularly relevant. This Award sets out to highlight the work of member cities and send out a message of peace and support for democracy and human rights. We will learn about the awarded initiatives at the next International Congress, which will be held in Curitiba in May. The Congress' agenda will provide us with new learnings in terms of sustainability, innovation, and social inclusion. Make sure not to miss it!



NETWORKS

Le Spanish Network of Educating Cities is

the biggest territorial network in the IAEC and comprises 236 cities. The city of Gijón/Xixón coordinated the network up to October 2023, when the city of Viladecans took over as coordinator. Under the coordination of Gijón/Xixón, the following thematic networks were operational: • *"Transformation of the City (Urban Agenda) from and with the Perspective of Childhood and Adolescence".* Coordinated by Rivas Vaciamadrid. • *"The Educating City in Training and Employment".* Coordinated by Málaga.

• *"The Educating City versus the Culture of Hate".* Coordinated by Seville.

And the working group, *"Educating Cities, Cities with Memory"*.

What is more, Gijón/Xixón held several working sessions to address topics of interest: the second conference on *"Education and History with Memory"*; the conference *"Evaluation of Educational Programmes"*, and the conference *"Inhabiting* Educating Cities: School Settings, Mobility and Health".

The Spanish Network held its sixteenth meeting in Gijón/Xixón in October 2023 with the tagline *"Educating Cities: Caring and Welcoming Cities",* attended by more than two hundred members. The event included the presentation of a selection of more than sixty good practices (out of the hundredplus experiences that had been submitted) and the **conclusions of the work of the thematic networks**. The programme included **several roundtables** and study visits to good practices in the host city. The meeting was a unique opportunity for the newly elected local authorities (after municipal elections held in May) to learn about the Network's activity.

The General Assembly of the Spanish Network elected Viladecans as the new coordinating city for the period 2023-2025, accompanied by a new Monitoring Commission formed by Argamasilla de Calatrava, Barcelona, Ciudad Real, Esplugues



de Llobregat, Gijón/Xixón, Las Palmas de Gran Canaria, Lleida, Oviedo, Tomelloso and Zaragoza; Granollers, Málaga, Rivas Vaciamadrid and Seville (as coordinating cities of thematic networks also participate in the meetings); and Avilés, Ibi and Vitoria-Gasteiz (as guest cities). The thematic networks proposed for this new period are:

• "Education and Culture. Strategies for the Construction of an Inclusive City/Community for the Development of a Critical and Creative Citizenship" (coordinated by Granollers);

• *"Inclusion: Cornerstone of the Educating City"* (coordinated by Málaga and Seville); *and*

• *"Children and Adolescents: Transforming their City"* (coordinated by Rivas Vaciamadrid).

The **Portuguese Network** coordinated by Lisbon and six other cities (Águeda; Lagoa (Algarve); Santo Tirso; Torres Vedras; Valongo and Vila Nova de Famalicão), held its 9th National Congress in Torres Vedras in November with the tagline *"Educating Cities, Children's Cities, Cities for All!"*. The Network also held national encounters in Angra do Heroísmo (*"Lifelong Education"*, November), Torres Novas (*"Education for Science and Sustainability"*, May) and Valongo, in January.

The following working groups were operational in 2023:

- Inclusive Cities (coordinated by Almada)
- Lifelong Education (coordinated by Loures)
- Play in the Educating City (coordinated by Torres Vedras)
- Local Educational Project (coordinated by Loulé)

The Inclusive Cities themed group met in Soure (October) and Fundão (February).

The **IAEC Delegation for Latin America,** based in Rosario, coordinates the work of cities and networks in the region.

It has a virtual classroom platform to offer online courses. In 2023, four courses were given, attended by 219 representatives from more than sixty Latin American cities:



• "Childhood and Early Childhood in Educating Cities. Does the Construction of the Commons include Girls and Boys?"

• "Principles and Values of an Educating City" (2 editions)

• "Sexual Diversity in Educating Cities"

In 2023, three thematic networks were operational, with a space in the Virtual Classroom to consult materials and videos, as well as a forum. Each of them convened two Learning Cyber C@fés as meeting spaces:

Culture Network:
Cultural Policies of Local Governments
Right to Culture in the Digital Age
Sustainability Network:

Citizen participation and co-responsibility in the adoption of fair, resilient and sustainable lifestyles and consumptions

The eco-dependent condition of human life and the physical limits of the planet

• Urban Planning Network:

Public Planning Space Public Living Space

Various educational dialogues were also held: "Public Gender Policies" (March) and "The Rights of Nature" (June), as well as awareness-raising days in San Francisco, Santa Fe and Córdoba.

The Delegation organises regular meetings with member cities. These include exchanges with Santa María, Porto Alegre, San Justo, Vitória Santo Antão, Curitiba, San Francisco, Manizales, Caguas and Guanajuato. It also works extensively to disseminate the work of the network and its members, boosting its impact and securing new memberships in Latin America.

The Argentinian Network of Educating Cities,

coordinated by San Justo, held the "Strategies to Respond Locally to Digital Culture Challenges" forum in San Francisco in March. In May, the 6th Argentinian Network Meeting was held in San Justo, focussed on "Technology and Social Innovation,



Fostering Sustainable People-Centred Cities". The event featured a roundtable with mayors, a speech, and a presentation of experiences of several educating cities.

In November, the Argentinian Network called a virtual meeting on *"Educating Identity: Culture, Source of Creation and Learning in the Educating City"*.

2023 was a year of municipal elections in Argentina. The new authorities took office in December.

The **Brazil Network (REBRACE)**, led by Curitiba, met monthly between February and November. At each meeting, topics related to the IAEC were discussed, with actions, good practices and educational policies implemented by member cities being presented. In 2023, the following topics were addressed: cross-sector engagement; culture, sport and leisure; income generation; health; governance and participation; sustainability; technology and innovation; and culture of peace. In October 2023, the 4th National Meeting of the Brazil Network was held in São Paulo, with the theme of "Promoting and Bolstering Transformative *Learning in the City"*. More than 130 attendees took part in the conference, structured around the following themes: (i) Lifelong learning; (ii) Promotion of quality of life and sustainability; and (iii) Many cultures, many learnings. The programme included speeches, project presentations, institutional meetings, and visits to good practices in the host city. At the Brazilian Network Assembly, Curitiba renewed its mandate as a coordinating city for the next two years, accompanied by Passo Fundo in the Coordination Commission. At the National Meeting, the first Brazilian Network newsletter was launched, featuring a compilation of good practices from member cities in Brazil.

The **Mexican Network (REMCE)** met in September in Playa del Carmen with the tagline *"Sustainability in Educating Cities"*, at a conference that included an opening speech by the mayor of

the host city, the presentation of projects of interest, study visits, and a participatory workshop. Within the framework of the General Assembly held at the meeting, Guanajuato took over from León as coordinator of the network. Member cities in Mexico also met in April and November.

The **Italian Network** held a virtual meeting in November to agree on the new coordinating city, as well as the priorities and work programme. Bologna took over as coordinating city, after Turin's proposal to hand over to another city.

Meanwhile, the **Asia Pacific Network** held its 11th Meeting in Changwon, coordinating city of the network. The event featured a presentation of good practices, a welcome for new members, and the joint celebration of the International Day of the Educating City. In 2023, the network published its annual newsletter with highlighted educating actions and programmes in the region.






Financial details

In accordance with article 32 of the IAEC Statutes in its condition as an international non-profit organisation, *it is financed by the fees paid by its members, through subsidies and special contributions to projects by other public and private entities, by donations, inheritances or legacies, and from the revenues from its own capital.* In 2023, the expenditure of the Association amounted to 268,455.72€. The fees are established according to the number of inhabitants of the cities and the Gross National Income per capita of the countries in which they are situated.

> The Congress is structured around the following axis: Social sustainability: inclusion and cultural pluralism; Environmental and economic sustainability: innovation and transformation of territories; and Education for sustainability.

From the 400-plus experiences received, the Scientific Committee of the 17th Congress has selected 115 experiences from 79 cities and 10 different countries, which will be shared in three formats: workshop, direct dialogue, and poster presentations. The 17th Congress will also feature presentations by experts in the field, as well as a roundtable of mayors, always with sustainability as the common denominator. Curitiba, as the host city, will also lay on study visits to the most iconic and innovative initiatives of the city, which itself is famous for being a paradigm of sustainability.

INTERNATIONAL DAY OF THE EDUCATING CITY 2023

Culture, Source of Creation and Learning in the Educating City

The eighth edition of the International Day of the Educating City was held on 30 November with the tagline *"Culture, Source of Creation and Learning in the Educating City".*

Educating Cities promote access to culture, ensuring equal opportunities in its enjoyment. What is more, we recognise the different cultures and cultural manifestations in our cities and we foster quality artistic education, which allows for personal and collective development. The International Day of the Educating City sets out to mobilise all the cultural stakeholders in cities in a dynamic and participatory celebration to promote dialogue and publicise the artistic opportunities that member cities offer and contribute, with this, to the creation of new synergies and learning opportunities.

The IAEC organised an opening event for the day on 29 November, with a conference on *Social and Cultural Inequalities and Equity Policies* led by Dr Nicolás Barbieri and the presentation of good practices from Katowice (Poland), Montevideo (Uruguay), and São Paulo (Brazil). At this edition, emphasis was placed on activities that bolster culture and education, such as cultural exhibitions, workshops and open days, popular festivals, intergenerational activities, musical performances, recreational activities, the painting of murals, and the public reading of the Declaration, among others. Numerous cities also carried out other traditional activities, such as the recognition of the city's educational stakeholders, the raising of the Educating Cities flag, the recording of video messages by the municipal authorities, and activities with IAEC materials (memory games and origami).

More than 180 cities from 12 countries took part in this event: Argentina, Belgium, Brazil, Cape Verde, Korea, Spain, Finland, France, Mexico, Poland, Portugal, and Puerto Rico.

Member cities once again demonstrated their creativity and the countless opportunities that their cities offer, in an inclusive and participatory way. Thank you to all the cities that joined in with the celebration!

>> RELIVE THE PRACTICAL WORKSHOP OF THE CODE OF ETHICS HERE

In a constantly changing world, knowing, promoting and respecting the values that define us as an association is key to building responsible organisational environments.

The General Assembly in March 2023 included a proposal for an improved **Code of Ethics** approved by the Executive Committee with contributions from member cities. A practical workshop on the importance of values was held in September with Dr Begoña Román, Professor of Ethics and Vice-Chancellor of Research at the School of Philosophy of the University of Barcelona.

To encourage the improvement of the code by all member cities, the current code was used to settle various practical cases with ethical dilemmas.

This will allow for final tweaks before the updated version is presented at the General Assembly to be held in Curitiba within the framework of the 17th International Congress of Educating Cities.

Throughout the year, the Secretariat met either virtually or in person with delegations from the following cities: Alcobendas, Andong, Changwon, Ciudad Real, Dakar, El Masnou, Goteborg, Guadalajara, Istanbul, Manizales, Passo Fundo, Pilar de la Horadada, Porto, and Porto Alegre.

Virtual **welcome sessions** were organised for the following new members: El Masnou, Gongju-Si, Parla and Yongsan-Gu.

The IAEC Secretariat took part in **training sessions** in Castell-Platja d'Aro and Vitoria-Gasteiz, as well as in the meeting of Educating Cities of the Girona Region held in Lloret de Mar.

In 2023, **interviews** were conducted with a selection of mayors from the following member cities so that they could share their impressions, challenges and key projects with the rest of the network: Andong, San Justo, San Pedro Tlaquepaque, Brussels, Curitiba, Torres Vedras and Gijón/Xixón.

Meanwhile, Seville hosted the IAEC **General Assembly** and **Executive Committee** meetings in March. The Committee met again in October in Curitiba to visit the facilities that will host the Congress and to meet with the authorities and representatives of the Scientific Committee.

EDUCATING CITIES AWARD




The Educating Cities Award, which is given out every two years, is the highest recognition of the International Association of Educating Cities to successful innovative experiences with measurable results of their impact on improving the living conditions of citizens, in keeping with the principles of the Charter of Educating Cities.

The Award sets out to recognise and give international visibility to the work of member cities, as well as to highlight best practices that can be a source of inspiration for other cities in the construction of more educating environments. The fifth edition of the Award focuses on **good practices in Values-based Education,** on experiences that educate in civic and democratic values to foster harmonious living and respect for the planet, and on experiences that nurture solidarity, the culture of peace, social justice, participation, environmental awareness and commitment to the common good.

More than **60 applications** have been received from **55 cities** in **11 countries**. The cornerstones of the 2024 Educating Cities Award are:

- Promotion of institutional values
- Culture of peace
- Co-creation and participation in community values

In 2023, fifteen new experiences were published.

The initiatives published last year addressed issues such as education for sustainability, the renaturation of urban spaces, and the recycling of organic waste. Various experiences dealt with gender equality, showing the strategies of different cities in the fight against gender violence and sexual assaults, in public and private spaces, vindicating the role of women throughout history, and also offering collective care spaces. Other initiatives focused on citizen participation in the proposal and the implementation of initiatives to improve cities, and also on the participation of young people in democratic and local governance processes. Online platform to share experiences, generate inspiration and foster cooperation between cities.

Young people were also protagonists in other experiences published in 2023, focusing on the promotion of emotional health and the creation of spaces for play, learning and socialisation outside schools. Last, but not least, there were experiences linked to local heritage, such as the recognition of ancient recipes and the recovery of iconic spaces that reflect and showcase the local collective history.

The Secretariat contributed to the analysis of the experiences submitted by cities wishing to participate in various meetings and encounters organised by the territorial networks, in the 2024 Educating Cities Award, and the 17th International Congress. This material is of great value for the database, as it may lead to new entries based on criteria of innovation, impact, and replicability. Focus experiences were also published.

In 2023, a new database application was developed, which will be operational in 2024. This new portal will present a renewed image and a more complete and intuitive search engine for the experience bank. The 550-plus experiences of the current bank will still be available, in addition to the new ones that are incorporated. This new database will also collate experiences presented by member cities to the regional and thematic meetings, Congresses, and the Educating Cities Award.




FOCUS EXPERIENCE 46 AIR-RAID SHELTER Sant Just Desvern
